
Dig Deeper into Joel 2:18-32 for personal study and Life Groups...



1) At 2v18 we move to the turning point of the book. How would you sum up the broad brush strokes of the book before and after this point? (The summary diagram of the book is beneath if you want to walk through it).

2) Let's look at the first promise 2:18-27 (Restoration). Why are the people so happy? Why should we be so happy? What will these verses mean for you?

3) In Acts 2:16, Peter says that what is happening is the fulfilment of this passage. What does the coming of Pentecost mean for salvation history? Charlie said that "capital P" prophecy is closed now that the Scriptures are written, but how can we "little p" prophesy both by faithfully edifying believers and evangelising unbelievers? (see 1 Cor 14:3, 1 Thess 5:20-21).

1) How does this language of judgement make you feel in 3:1-16a? What will help us to keep thinking of it as good news? What action does it spur you to?

2) v16b- 21 speaks of more wonderful promises for the future. Which of these are picked up in Revelation 21: 1-4 and Revelation 22:1-5? And so what is God promising you?

3) All of the blessings in the second half of the book turn on true repentance in chapters 1 & 2 (esp 2:12-13). Has the Lord convicted you of any particular areas that you need to turn from in this series? Have you learned that 2:27 "I am the Lord your God, and that there is no other?" or do you see split loyalty in any areas in your life?
