Dig Deeper: Men & Women1- Equal & Different- "Positive Complementarianism"

Talk 1 (Sunday 14th Sept): "Equal and different"

Men & Women #1 - "Equal and Different"

1) CREATION Men and Women are <u>equal</u> in dignity yet <u>different</u> in design

2) CRISIS Men and Women are <u>equally</u> fallen yet show brokenness in <u>different</u> ways

3) CHRIST

Jn 1:14, Lk 8:3, Mt28:1,
Gal 3:28, Eph 5:22-33

Men and Women are equal in the church yet Christ has different roles for us

4) NEW CREATION Men and Women though different will one day be praising Christ as his bride!

Lifegroups Session 1 (week commencing 14th Sept), questions to choose from...

- 1. Why do you think it is so important to look at what the Bible is saying when discussing this issue? Do you think there are any ways in which the Bible is out of date? Are you willing to change your mind if you discover something new in God's Word?
- 2. What issues, questions, even hopes or fears do you bring to a series on men and women? NB the Q&A discussion evening on 1st October (see below).
- 3. Have another look at Genesis 1:27. Where do we end up if we fail to include both sides of the "equal and different" pair? Can you think of ways in which we may be in danger of doing that?
- 4. How do you see the "battle of the sexes" Gen 3:16 played out today?
- 5. How was Christ the perfect human? How did he succeed in imaging God where Adam failed? How did he treat women? How do you (men &women) want to be like him?
- 6. As a church and in marriage, is it possible for men and women to be equal (Gal 3:28) yet to have different roles (Eph 5:22-33, 1 Cor 11:3, 1 Tim 2:11-15)?

Spend some time praying together about all this.

A couple of terms...

- "Complementarianism"- the theological idea that men and women have different and complementary roles in the home and the church.
- "Egalitarianism" the theological idea that there are no distinctions between the roles men and women can take in the home and the church.
