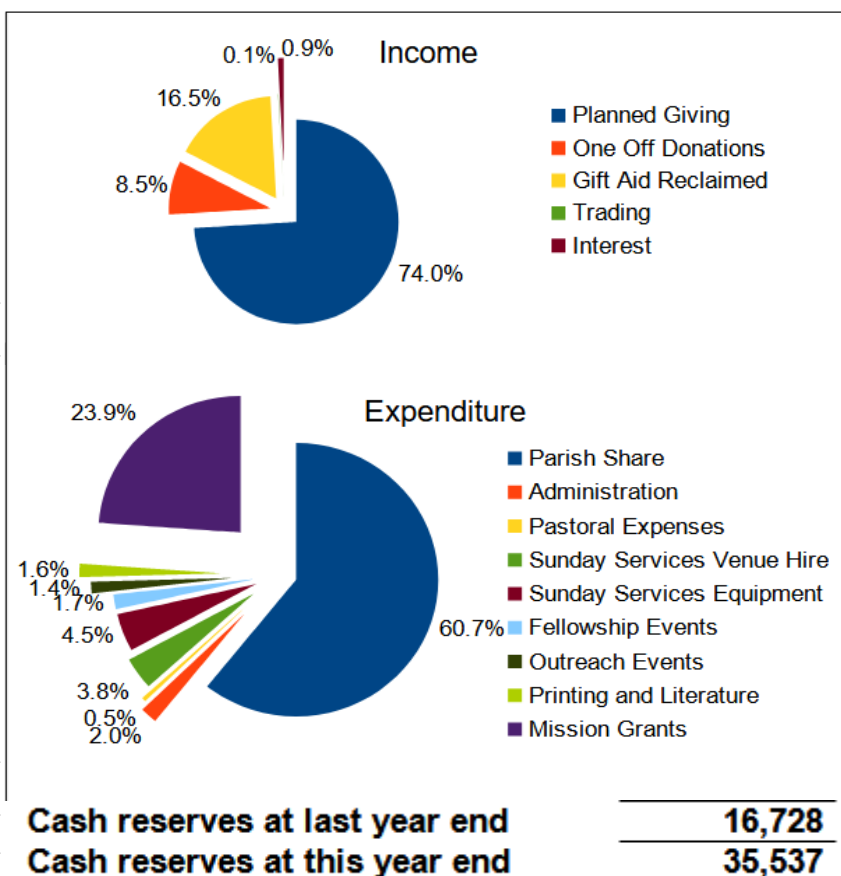

- God has provided for us through difficult times – He has provided so very abundantly! Other charities and churches have seen income drop, but we have actually seen giving hold pretty steady – indeed it increased by 10% from our budget! By contrast, our costs dropped due to not hiring a venue and moving to online church, so we had a net surplus of £18,809.
- We have been able to share God’s generosity to others
 - Mission Grants – we have been able to continue and even increase our support of mission partners who are seeking to bring the good news of Jesus to their communities, including local church Christchurch South Cambs, the Kairos project reaching out in HMP Littlehey, Dan & Pippa Halpin training for ministry in the UK and Diego heading back to Brazil to a church there.
 - Hardship Fund – we have been able to support members of the church family who are going through financial hardship by some one-off gifts.
 - Gifts to community projects and food banks – we have given some extra gifts to two local food banks and to community projects looking to support families in particular need, backing up the time and practical help given by congregation members.
- Support of a second staff worker – we have been able to put the 2018 grant from StAG to good use in supporting a second staff worker and equip him with (remote) training through the Corn Hill training college in London.
 - The 2018 grant will cover us for about 3.5 more years of a staff worker (to Aug 2024)
- Reserves at good level – we have £35,537 in reserves, about 6 months of average expenditure, which fulfils the council’s reserves policy. It means that as a church, we will be able to continue to serve God’s purposes and have the opportunity to support more ministries as we seek to reach out anew to Huntingdon as lockdown lifts.
